Q & A with Pastor Rob

Q: Are we almost done with all these sermons on King David?

A: Almost! We'll end the series just in time for Sunday School Kickoff.

Q: Why all this focus on David?

A: Because he's amazing and flawed. He seeks God with his whole heart, wanders away, and comes back home. Best of all, he never gives up. He's us written in bold letters.

Q: But aren't we a New Testament church? **A:** Nope. We're a Bible-loving church — as in the whole Bible — not just the pretty parts and not just the Jesus parts. The Old Testament gives you the vocabulary to understand the New.

Q: Huh?

A: When Jesus calls himself the Lamb of God, what does that mean? He's fluffy and not too bright? No. He's adapting the stories of the Old Testament, especially Passover. Jesus loved those old scriptures. He quoted them, studied them, and borrowed their language.

Q: So understanding David helps us understand Jesus?

A: Yes. And understanding David helps us understand ourselves. His courage inspires us, and his failures remind us that gritting your teeth and trying harder doesn't work. We need forgiveness, and we need each other.





"Ditty Bags" for sailors on ships, at sea for long periods of time. They need help with donations of material to make the bags, items to put in the bags and, or monetary donations to purchase these items. Here are some suggested donation items:

Materials to Make Bag:

Fabric – two pieces of washable, sturdy, colorful cloth which measure 12x18" or one piece 12x36"
Drawstrings – a pair of 30" shoelaces, any color or two 30" lengths of suitable material which slides smoothly, will not unravel, and has no knots (twine, thin cord or crocheted rug or plastic canvas yarn.)

Items to Fill Bag:

Toothpaste, Toothbrush, Dental Floss, Cologne, Shaving Cream, Shaving Lotion, Razors, Hair Brushes, Deodorant, Combs, Nail Files, Nail Clippers, Gloves, Knit hats, Scarves, Long Underwear, Socks, Shoelaces, Shoe Polish, Mending Kit, Playing Cards, Memo Pads, Pens, Pencils, Calendars, Kleenex, Band aids, First Aid Kit.

Mid Year Recap

Our Heritage fund at 6/30/12 is \$381,721 which is an increase of over \$8,700 since the beginning of the year. We have seen some months with increases and some with losses reflecting current gains, losses, dividends, and transfers. The fund consists of stocks and a money market account. Many of the stocks pay dividends which we then have available if there is a shortfall in cash flow needs. It is the trustee's hopes that collections cover the budget needs and the dividends can be reinvested into the Heritage fund for our future.

Collections for the first half of 2012 averaged \$1,759 (only \$80 short of our budget) — we are very close!! The trustees continue to strive to be great stewards of the church resources and the gifts you give to continue God's work through our church and community.

Church expenses continue to be very close to the budget. Great planning Trustees!!
