It is our hope to be back worshipping inside the church meeting house as of **October 4th!** While pre-recorded worship and Drive-In Church have both been an adventure, it will feel good to get back into our prayed in/lived in pews. \*\*Please note that this date is dependent on the current Executive Order.\*\* A letter will be sent out to the congregation following next Mondays Board of Ministry meeting detailing our safety measures and what you can expect from this experience.

We will be wrapping up Drive-In Church on September 13th. The following two Sundays (September 20th & 27th) the congregation is invited to worship online with our sister church North Shore Congregational Church in Fox Pointe, WI. The Rev. Dr. Marty Hall and I have been working together to craft an intentional worship service that celebrates two congregations in fellowship in a common live-stream. A invitation video with instruction will be circulated starting mid-week. This will be a true experiment in our Congregational value of Fellowship :)

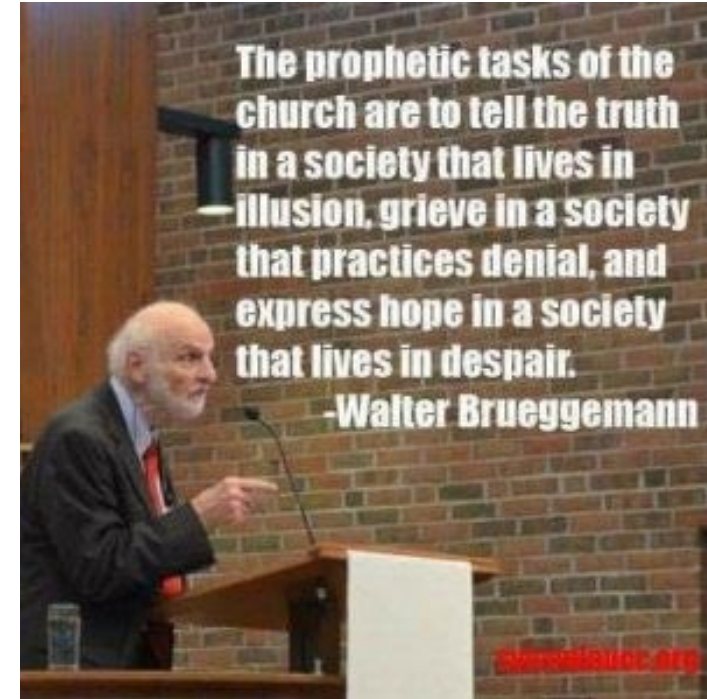
